

# BRIDGES - WEEK 3: BRIDGING PAIN AND SORROW

**THE POINT:** EMOTIONS ARE A GIFT FROM GOD GIVEN TO US TO NAVIGATE LIFE. HOWEVER, WE ARE NOT RULED BY EMOTIONS. WE ARE RULED BY JESUS.

**TEXTS:** JOHN 11:1-44



What are you learning about Jesus that helps you navigate life? What have you learned lately that changes who you are at work, home or in your community?

# **TEACHING & DIALOGUE**

Have someone read John 11:1-27 out loud. Feel free to take turns reading one verse at a time.

- 1. John makes a point by mentioning Jesus' love for Lazarus, Mary and Martha. Why is it important in the context of this account for us to know this? (Jesus acts from a place of love, not control. At first glance, He may not appear loving as He delays coming to their "rescue" but ultimately, His love demonstrates the glory of God. Additionally, He shows how love overcomes all fear by going to a place that has not been safe for Him or the disciples.)
- 2. Re-read verses 21-27. Jesus states, "I am the resurrection and the life." What does this mean? How does it change the way a believer navigates the world? (We have an ultimate hope. Jesus is the source and power that will resurrect those who have believed on the day of judgment. While this does not prevent the pain of loss for Martha and Mary, it does comfort them in their mourning. Jesus is the way to eternal life and yet in Him, we find true life as we were designed to be.)
- 3. Do you find yourself dwelling on the circumstances of your life instead of the direction of your life? (Share as you feel led.)

#### Have someone read John 11:28-44 out loud.

- 4. Jesus is deeply moved by Mary and those mourning Lazarus. What does it show us about Him that He wept alongside them? (It shows us that Jesus is compassionate. He meets us where we are. God is not a god that requires us to clean up our feelings or actions to be near to Him.)
- 5. When Jesus asks that the stone be moved away, Martha doubts the reason why. Do you ever have things happen where you can relate to this? Any specific instance you can look back on that seems clearer now than it did before? (Martha had no trouble believing Jesus could prevent the death of her brother but doubts he could be raised back to life. Feel free to share an example where you doubted God could come through.)



6. Why is it important that Jesus does not discourage the weeping over Lazarus? How can you practically allow your emotions to help you navigate life instead of rule your life? (To tell someone to stop feeling will only push those feelings down and will not help them heal. This may be why Jesus allows those around Him to weep. Acknowledging your emotions without making snap decisions because of them can teach you self control over time.)

# **ACTION STEP**

Have you ever been disappointed in God? What do you do when He doesn't respond as you hoped? Are you more like Martha who went out to meet Jesus with a possible accusatory tone? Or are you more like Mary who remained isolated until Jesus called for her, then ran to Him and fell weeping at His feet? Jesus can handle all of our emotions including the messy ones. Why does this make such a difference in helping us know how to go to Jesus for comfort?
