SERMON TEXTS: Luke 8:40-56, Romans 1:16, 2:4, 3:23-24, 5:8, 6:8-9, 10:9-10, 8:28 & 31

TEACHING & DIALOGUE

DISCOVER

Let's dig into the text together and discover what's happening in this passage.

Read Luke 8:40-56 out loud as a group, with each person reading one verse at a time.

- 1. Here we see two interwoven miracles performed by Jesus. What are the contrasts and similarities that exist between each situation? (Contrasts: The girl's father, Jairus would have been at the top of society, while the sick woman would have been most likely at the bottom. The sick woman was also suffering for 12 years, while the girl's situation is most likely more sudden. Similarities: Jesus is sought in both circumstances, both are desperate last resorts and faith in Jesus heals both.)
- 2. The bleeding woman would have been suffering not just physically but also financially, spiritually and emotionally. Based off of Luke 43 and Leviticus 15:2, what can we know about her and her living situation? (Physical 12 years is a long time, she was physically worn down. Financial She was broke and "spent all her living". Spiritual/Emotional She was ceremonially unclean based off Levitical law and most likely an outcast both religiously and socially. She was alone.)
- 3. The woman snuck up to touch Jesus (v44), then came forward while trembling (v47). If the woman believed in Jesus's power, why all of the fear? (She was embarrassed by her condition and didn't want to walk about in a crowd. She was ceremonially unclean, thus by deliberately

- touching Jesus, she believed would make Him unclean. She may also have feared Jesus's rebuke and possible public scolding or humiliation.)
- 4. What does Jesus's reaction (v46) and statements (v48, v50, v54) tell us about who He is and what He offers everyone who believes? (We cannot hide. His power is inexhaustible in that immediately after healing the woman, he boldly declares the girl will "be well". Jesus not only heals afflictions but also desires us to "go in peace". When we experience Jesus's power to save, we know we've been made right, free to delight and have peace in knowing He is Lord.)

DEEPEN

Now let's go deeper into what it means to be saved by grace alone, through faith in Christ alone.

A verse from Romans starts each question as we walk down the Roman Road together.

- 1. Read Romans 3:23-24 and 5:8. Christ died for our past, present and future sins. What past sins do you hold on to or what present sins are you still struggling with? (No matter how we have sinned or how we are currently sinning, Christ's death was for that. We didn't earn it. "While we were still sinners" means we can't lose. Admitting we are sinners in need of Jesus is our first step.)
- 2. Read Romans 10:9-10. Do you remember when you first believed in your heart and confessed with your mouth that Jesus is your Lord and Savior? Share this story with the group. (Share as you feel led.)
- 3. Read Romans 6:8-9 and 8:31. Do you believe when Jesus said, "It is finished", that it counted for you and that it's all that you need? What are you asking Him for? (Answers may vary. Be ready to (ESPN) encourage, point to Scripture, pray with and over if needed and help with next steps.)

ACTION STEP

Take ONE more step towards Jesus. This week, set aside five minutes each day to think about Jesus's words in Luke 8:50 when He says "don't be afraid, only believe". Each day, write down the thing that seems out of control, helpless or impossible and then set it aside. Tell God, "today, I'm taking Jesus with me and leaving everything on the list behind."
